It has been another busy term in Enterprise!

On a Thursday, we offer amazing staff lunches where our learners purchase the ingredients, take the orders, cook the food and deliver the final product to staff members!

Learners use skills such as budgeting, money handling, food hygiene and safety.

On a Friday, for our café option **we bake! The café is a large part of Enterprise where we serve our peers and staff**, learning about money handling and customer service. I work closely with Gary (Careers Leader) to gauge skills which can go towards work experience options for our learners.

We also do crafts including handmade cards, gifts and wooden items alongside DT - we hope to be able to sell our handmade items again in the near future!

A recent success from our school council is that we have had a new inclusive roundabout installed in our lovely playground! Our learners also recognised that the staircases in school can be difficult to navigate when there are lots of people using them. They suggested placing stickers of arrows on the floor to indicate an up and down system, ensuring staff and learners stay to the left when going up and down, resulting in the safety of all learners. The arrows have now been put in place and are working well!


