Tiger class have had a great first half term and have settled well into the new school year – we are also looking forward to a week's break next week!

This term, we have enjoyed exploring our topic of 'Me and my world'. We have looked at 'Me and my body', 'Friends, family and people who help us', and 'My home, my school and my health'. Alongside our daily activities, we have enjoyed some special visitors, including The Travelling Librarian, bag books, Diddi Dance with Charlotte, and music with Anita.

In 'independence and life skills', we have worked on brushing our hair and exploring hair accessories, as well as brushing our teeth. We have also enjoyed exploring our emotions in sensory massage.

In 'thinking and learning', we have looked at counting and number recognition up to 10, ensuring we understand 1:1 correspondence, as well as exploring different colours, shape and sizes.

In 'communication', we have enjoyed listening to different sensory stories and exploring props linked to our topic, including 'Me and my body', 'emergency', 'the three little pigs' and 'this is the way we look after ourselves'.
